Better begins here. This is the slogan Wellspring chose and it is the promise we make to our clients, to our supporters and to our communities. We strive to make people's lives better. Sometimes it is a small thing: a bite to eat, a warm coat, or a compassionate ear to listen. Sometimes it is life changing: Assistance that keeps a family from becoming homeless, support to keep heat and electricity running during a cold winter, legal advocacy that allows a client to understand and better cope with life's issues, or providing the educational opportunities that improve the chances for independence and selfsufficiency.

38 years ago, The Rev. Diane Edson had a vision. A beautiful vision that gave people a compassionate avenue to seek help, whether that help was a needed article of clothing, a cup of coffee or simply someone to talk to. Today that vision extends through the South Shore with the many new and expanded program offerings that address current and emerging needs in the communities we serve.

Hunger and Food Insecurity is the primary focus of Aunt Dot's Kitchen (Wellspring's Food Pantry). Expanded hours and transportation & delivery options ensure that a client in need can always gain access to healthy and plentiful food. Wellspring, in partnership with South Shore Health, delivers individual tailored food selections to neighbors across the region who are hungry while also battling depression/anxiety or hypertension. Wellspring's Food Truck and certified kitchen work together to create opportunities and expand access to, not just food, but all of Wellspring's services.



"Access" is a barrier to many families in need on the South Shore. By offering transportation to and from Aunt Dot's Kitchen and the Adult Learning Program we remove that obstacle and make the distance between getting help and missed opportunities much smaller.

Both Thrift and Furniture shops continue to be the gentle entry point into Wellspring that Diane Edson envisioned those many years ago while raising sustainable revenue to feed the vital programs and services. Additionally, these shops provide the opportunity for students in the Sprout Center for Jobs to build needed skills and experience through internships and training.





Wahlburgers locations. Anne and her husband, Chef Erik Stenfors, also owned and operated a beloved Northern Italian-Mediterranean themed restaurant in Hull for 8 years.

In addition to that, she is managing Aunt Dot's Kitchen, serving up food on the Wellspring Truck at various local events, and always cooking up nutricious, delicious meals in our commercial kitchen in Hull. Given her years of experience and vast expertise in the culinary world, we are looking forward to watching her grow our food program to its full potential.

Throughout my life, I was always interested in learning about other cultures and traveled extensively when I had the opportunity.

I moved to Randolph because I liked and respected the diversity of the town. While working in Randolph Schools, I became interested in the ESL and Languages Department and taught an ESOL program for Parents.

WELLSPRING SUCCESS STORY ELDER SERVICES

Over the past 35 years, Diane has worked cleaning houses and businesses. Not having a drivers license, she worked almost exclusively in Hull and walked all over town to her different job locations. Married with children, she raised her family in Hull and was well known throughout the community. Four years ago, a sudden heart attack took her husband and her life began to unravel. Without his income, she could no longer afford to stay in her home and had to move into an apartment.

Wellspring assisted in getting her the veterans benefits she was entitled to and connected her to several other programs such as MassHealth and SNAP. However, as the cost of living increased and inflation soared, Diane struggled to stay afloat. She took in a roommate to share housing costs. But at age 64, the physicality of cleaning was beginning to catch up with her. Several months ago, Diane fell at the worksite and broke many of her front teeth. She found herself unable to chew properly and felt embarrassed to smile. Mass Health could not offer dental insurance coverage. Diane's only option was to fund her own very expensive dental repairs.

Over the past several years, Elder Care Director Margaret Mellon has worked to create an initiative to help clients with dental problems. She has made connections to local funders as well as dentists who offer their services at reduced rates. This has helped over a dozen clients with getting repairs or much needed dentures. When Margaret heard about Diane, she quickly got involved. Working in partnership with Dr. Locke's Office and the St. Vincent DePaul Society, Margaret got Diane onto a fully funded treatment plan to repair her teeth and restore her smile.

CASSIE'S STORY

I am interested in not only furthering my education but earning a career in Psychology. I am currently enrolled as an undergraduate attending Quincy College. I am on track to earning nine credits for Bridgewater State University this upcoming fall. This scholarship would help support my career goals financially and would have a major impact towards my success in the Psychology field. It would also give me an opportunity to expand my knowledge and use it for a greater purpose. My grandmother and mother were both mental health workers. My grandmother was a working nurse for many years. They both have inspired me to do the same. Earning this scholarship would be a huge accomplishment for my family, but most importantly to me.

In 2019, I became very ill. I was missing classes and falling behind. Although I had struggled, I was still able to pass my freshman year with the help of my teachers. By 2020, the fatigue grew worse. After multiple doctor visits, I was diagnosed with Systemic Lupus. Covid was at its peak and school had become virtual. During this time, I continued to have difficulty attending online classes. I was drained mentally and physically because I've always been a good student. I was able to graduate from my sophomore year of online school. Junior year finally approached, and school had resumed their in-person classes. My school had removed the option to remain online altogether. Due to lupus complications, I was in no condition to be in school or exposed to Covid. Unfortunately, I had to withdraw from public school.

After finding a virtual school, I began my junior year. I quickly realized the difference in pace and workload. I became very overwhelmed. The school lacked the resources and ability to accommodate my disability, as promised. The stress led to greater health issues. I was hospitalized on many occasions causing me to miss more time in class. By the end of the year, I was unable to pass my junior year of online school. I tried enrolling back into public school again. I was denied the opportunity to be a senior and or take extra courses. We struggled to find a solution and I was devastated.

That was when we discovered Wellspring. I began my enrollment where I was taught and motivated to achieve my diploma. I completed my education and graduated by December of 22'. Although these obstacles held me back, I was able to overcome the circumstances. Wellspring gave me the opportunity to excel in many different aspects of their program.

Attending Wellspring, I was offered a chance to apply for this scholarship. This would be building a path for my career. In Fall of 2023, I will be able to learn the practice of Psychology. I did not believe this was possible a year ago. With the guidance of Wellspring, I am now attending Quincy College. I am driven to work towards my bachelor's in science. I have the support of MRC and have applied for FAFSA. I am going to spend the next four years dedicated to Bridgewater State. I believe the Pathways to Success scholarship would provide financial support in contributing to the world of Psychology.

Getting to Know: Emily Curtis Pott

Chair, Wellspring Board of Directors

"I hope, during my time as Chair, I can help promote awareness of Wellspring and our services to people who need us now, people who may need us someday and people who are attracted to our mission, as I was, and want to help to support our mission and the people we serve."

Emily Curtis Pott was born and raised in Hingham where she now resides with her husband Brian, their daughter Madeleine (7) and their dog Poppy. Hingham is also home to Curtis Management Corp. the commercial real estate business she has led, as President, for the past 8 years. During this time Emily has overseen the management of over 500,000 sqft of retail property, directed the purchase and sale of over \$100m of commercial real estate, and managed hundreds of tenants ranging from retail giants to sole proprietors and residential tenants as well.

After earning a B.A in Communications from Salve Regia University in Newport RI, Emily got her start in real estate where she worked for several years as a licensed sales and leasing agent in Newport and the surrounding area. Looking to be closer to home, Emily moved back to Boston where she spent a brief period as the events coordinator for the Top of The Hub restaurant atop the Prudential building, before joining AvalonBay Communities in Quincy & Hingham as a leasing agent and property manager. In 2013, Emily joined her father, Brian Curtis, at Curtis Management, the property management & real estate development company he led for over 35 years. Following Brian's passing in 2015, her brother Tom joined Emily at the business where they currently manage over 200,000 sqft of retail property throughout southeastern Massachusetts.

Emily was introduced to Wellspring through Ginny Gray, her maternal grandmother, who put her in touch with Vinny Harte when Curtis Management was moving offices and was looking for a place to donate excess office furniture. Ginny was a role model to many in the community, including Emily, as she spent a lifetime serving the community through various non-profit organizations. So, upon Ginny's passing in 2018, Emily made a conscious effort to get involved in the community outside of the office. Initially

attracted to the motto: a hand up, not a handout, and with some encouragement from Robert Edson, Emly joined Wellspring in 2018 as a Trustee of the Foundation Board, was nominated to for the Board of Directors in 2020 before becoming its Chair in 2023. On her leadership style, Emily says she learned from her father that listening can often be the most impactful tool in the toolbox, which is a critical skill in Wellspring where the leadership role demands sensitivity to the complex problems people face in all aspects of life. She credits her Wellspring mentors for giving her confidence for this role - Robert Edson, Kris Broe, Vinny Harte, and Paul Taylor have all been standouts. She is excited for the future of Wellspring, and with the newly appointed Vice Chair, Eddie Liao, by her side her goal is to both introduce and reintroduce people to our organization: "Wellspring is a well-known organization in the community, but as we provide such a wide array of services, even people who have worked directly with Wellspring often are unaware of the full range of services Wellspring provides throughout the community and the number of people Wellspring impacts each and every day. I hope, during my time as Chair, I can help promote awareness of Wellspring and our services to people who need us now, people who may need us someday and people who are attracted to our mission, as I was, and want to help to support our mission and the people we serve."

Emily is also a trained yoga instructor, a member of the Episcopal Parish of St. John the Evangelist in Hingham, and member of the Hingham Yacht Club. In her free time, she enjoys boating, skiing and spending time with her family.

Her situation continued to get worse until one night, Dorothy's boyfriend threw her out of his house.

With no place to go, she began what would become a four year process of couch surfing. Having grown up in Hull, she reached out to Wellspring where she received Domestic Violence Counseling and assistance in completing Champ applications. Last week, she was notified she had qualified for an affordable housing unit in Pembroke. Wellspring was able to then provide further assistance in getting her a new couch as well many other needed items to furnish her new place.

So very grateful, Dorothy feels like her life has begun again as she moves into a new phase where she is happy, independent and safe.

WELLSPRING SUCCESS STORY DISABILITY

Gary has been a Weymouth resident for 11 years and was the primary care-giver for his sick, elderly parents. After they both passed away, Gary started a new chapter in his life, he moved into an apartment, trained to become a barber and got a new job. He got into a new routine and was finally feeling a sense of stability, then suddenly contracted COVID. He had preexisting health conditions which exacerbated the fine motor skills in his hands and resulted in long COVID. Along with losing the movement in his hands, he was hospitalized multiple times.

He has now been a client of Wellspring for almost three years. He was originally referred to our organization by South Shore Health and the Flex meal program. Our Outreach Director, Jenny, first met him while he was still suffering the effects of long COVID. Upon learning about his situation, she assisted him with Fuel Assistance, SNAP food stamps and financial assistance from QCAP (Quincy Community Action Programs).

After having more in-depth conversations with Gary, he expressed the need for further assistance. Jenny referred him to our legal counsel, Kim, who determined he was eligible for SSI (Supplemental Security Income). While he awaited his SSI, Jenny applied for EAEDC (Emergency Aid to the Elderly, Disabled and Children) on his behalf.

Most Recently, he has been having trouble paying his rent and although he had a great relationship with his landlord, he has been sent a notice to quit for non-payment. Jenny assisted him in applying for CHAMP (Common Housing Application for Massachusetts Public Housing) as an emergency applicant. His health and well-being would improve immensely if he were able to live in an affordable, safe apartment. Gary qualified for senior housing and disability and was able to find a new home where he is happy, safe and appreciative with the help of Wellspring.
